A few notes on the songs...

These songs can be played in any key. Most of these songs are made up of three chords: The I, IV, and V.

- in the key of G the I, IV, and V chords are (G, C, and D)
- in the key of C the I, IV, and V chords are (C, F, and G)
- in the key of D the I, IV and V chords are (D, G and A)
- in the key of A the I, IV and V chords are (A, D and E)
- in the key of B the I, IV and V chords are (B, E, and F#)
- in the key of E the I, IV and V chords are (E, A, and B)

Occasionally the relative minor is used in a song. We call this the VI or 6th minor chord.

- in the key of G the relative minor is Em
- in the key of C the relative minor is Am
- in the key of D the relative minor is Bm
- in the key of A the relative minor is F#m
- in the key of B the relative minor is G#m
- in the key of E the relative minor is C#m

There are endless ways to interpret or play these songs so play around with them in different keys etc. You can't hurt them, most of them have been around a long time.

TARGHEE MUSIC CAMP

As we celebrate 11 years of Targhee Music Camp we are reminded that it is a sense of place and a feeling that a landscape can hold special power that are a big part of the draw that brings folks together to celebrate, participate and learn more about music at Grand Targhee each year. This combination of music and place has created a community of enthusiasts that gather from all regions of the globe each August for the Targhee Music Camp and for the Grand Targhee Bluegrass Festival, which celebrates its 29th anniversary this year.



This pilgrimage of music lovers didn't develop overnight. Grand Targhee Ski Resort is quite remote and isn't near any large metropolitan areas. The reputation of great music at Grand Targhee grew from one attendee to the next by friends who shared stories of their musical experiences at Grand Targhee with others. Also, among musicians the word spread that there was a great audience and place to gig in the Northern Rockies.

By 2005 Tom Garnsey (festival promoter) and Ben Winship (musician) who have both been very active in the development of the festival and continue to be, decided to add a music camp. Current camp director, Thomas Sneed, points out, "The phenomenal opportunity of having musicians arrive earlier in the week to teach and jam has proven to be successful over the last 11 years. There are LEGENDS about different jam sessions and workshops that have taken place."



In 2015, the Targhee Music Foundation was established and became an official 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. The foundation was set up to ensure that Targhee Music Camp continues on solid

financial footing and that the scholarship program can increase. Please support the Targhee Music Foundation so that the music can continue for years to come.
